

ORDINANCE NO. 118-70

AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE ALLEY NORTH OF COLORADO AVENUE EXTENDING FROM IOWA AVENUE TO AUGUSTA AVENUE, IN THE CITY OF LORAIN, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on the 18th day of May, 1970, a petition signed by 90% of the owners of property abutting on the Alley north of Colorado Avenue extending from Iowa Avenue to Augusta Avenue, in the City of Lorain, Ohio, was duly presented to Council, praying that said Alley be vacated, and,

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 723.06, notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition is not required, and,

WHEREAS, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Lorain, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Alley north of Colorado Avenue extending from Iowa Avenue to Augusta Avenue, in the City of Lorain, Ohio, be and the same is hereby vacated, subject, however, to the reservation that the City of Lorain, Ohio, reserves to itself and others, easement rights to construct or maintain sewer lines, water lines, gas lines, electric conduits, telephone and electric pole lines and other similar facilities under, on or above said alley whenever deemed necessary by the City of Lorain, Ohio.

SECTION 2. That one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the width of said alley shall revert to the abutting owners on each side of said alley.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency, necessary for the peace, health and welfare of the abutting property owners and welfare of the city, and will take effect immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. 119-70

AN ORDINANCE VACATING 7TH STREET EXTENDING FROM THE WEST LINE OF WASHINGTON AVENUE TO THE EAST LINE OF HAMILTON AVENUE, IN THE CITY OF LORAIN, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on the 18th day of May 1970, a petition signed by 84.15% of the owners abutting on 7th Street extending from the west line of Washington Avenue to the east line of Hamilton Avenue, was duly presented to Council, praying that said Street be vacated, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 723.06, notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition is not required, and

WHEREAS, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for; that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Lorain, State of Ohio :

SECTION 1. That 7th Street extending from the west line of Washington Avenue to the east line of Hamilton Avenue in the City of Lorain, Ohio, be and the same hereby is vacated, subject, however to the reservations that the City of Lorain, Ohio, reserves to itself and others, easement rights to construct or maintain sewer lines, water lines, gas lines, electric conduits, telephone and electric pole lines and other similar facilities under, on or above said street whenever deemed necessary by the City of Lorain, Ohio.

SECTION 2. That one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the width of said street shall revert to the abutting owners on each side of said street.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency; necessary for the immediate construction of an addition to Lorain High School, and will take effect immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
