ordinance no. 23 - 49

AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE ALLEY BETWEEN LONG AVENUE AND LEXINGTON AVENUE EXTENDING FROM THE SOUTH LINE OF WEST 14th STREET TO THE NORTH LINE OF THE ALLEY SOUTH OF WEST 14th STREET.

WHEREAS, on the 17th day of February, 1969, a petition signed by all the owners of property abutting on the Alley between Long Avenue and Lexington Avenue extending from the south line of West 14th Street to the north line of the alley south of West 14th Street, was duly presented to Council, praying that said alley be vacated, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 723.06, notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition is not required, and

WHEREAS, Council upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for; that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Lorain, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Alley between Long Avenue and Lexington Avenue extending from the south line of West 14th Street to the north line of the alley south of West 14th Street, in the City of Lorain, Ohio, be the same hereby is vacated, subject, however, to the reservation that the City of Lorain, Ohio, reserves to itself and others, easement rights to construct or maintain sewer lines, water lines, gas lines, electric conduits, telephorand electric pole lines and other similar facilities under, on or above said alley whenever deemed necessary by the City of Lorain, Ohio.

SECTION 2. That the petitioner, in consideration for the vacation of this Alley, shall, at his own expense, close the intersection of the Alley with 14th Street by constructing curb and sidewalk through the intersection said work to be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer. This ordinance shall not take effect and be in force until satisfactory completion of this work.

SECTION 3. That one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of the width of said alley shall revert to the abutting owners on each side of said Alley.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE ALLEY BETWEEN LONG AVENUE AND LEXINGTON AVENUE EXTENDING FROM THE SOUTH LINE OF WEST 14th STREET TO THE NORTH LINE OF THE ALLEY SOUTH OF WEST 14th STREET.

WHEREAS, on the 17th day of February, 1969, a petition signed by all the owners of property abutting on the Alley between Long Avenue and Lexington Avenue extending from the south line of West 14th Street to the north line of the alley south of West 14th Street, was duly presented to Council, praying that said alley be vacated, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 723.06, notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition is not required, and

WHEREAS, Council upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for; that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Lorain, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Alley between Long Avenue and Lexington Avenue extending from the south line of West 14th Street to the north line of the alley south of West 14th Street, in the City of Lorain, Ohio, be the same hereby is vacated, subject, however, to the reservation that the City of Lorain, Ohio, reserves to itself and others, easement rights to construct or maintain sewer lines, water lines, gas lines, electric conduits, telephone and electric pole lines and other similar facilities under, on or above said alley whenever deemed necessary by the City of Lorain, Ohio.

SECTION 2. That the petitioner, in consideration for the vacation of this Alley, shall, at his own expense, close the intersection of the Alley with 14th Street by constructing curb and sidewalk through the intersection, said work to be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer. This ordinance shall not take effect and be in force until satisfactory completion of this work.

SECTION 3. That one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of the width of said alley shall revert to the abutting owners on each side of said Alley.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2019

To vacate a certain portion of an alley in the City of Lorain, Ohio, lying between a certain alley now located between 14th Street and 15th Street and 15th Street, which portion to be so vacated is located 350 feet Westerly from the West line of Lexington Avenue and is 16 feet in width and Northerly and being further located between Lots Numbers Fourteen (14) and Fifteen (15) in Block Number Thirty-four (34), Selah Chamberlain's Addition to the City, of Lorain, Ohio.

WHEREAS, on the day of lots in the immediate vicinity of that portion of the 16 foot alley which lies between 15th Street and the alley between 14th and 15th Streets, and further described as being between Lots Numbers Fourteen (14) and Fifteen (15), in Block Number Thirty-four (34) Selah Chamberlain's Addition, fronting 16 feet on 15th Street and running Northerly a distance of 154.5 feet to said alley between 14th and 15th Streets, was duly presented to Council praying that said portion of said alley between the points named, as herein described, be vacated. And

WHEREAS, written consent has been filed with Council to such vacation by the owners of the property abutting the portion of said alley to be so vacated. And

WHEREAS, Council, upon Hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest of the City of Lorain and ought to be made.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Council of the City of Lorain, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1:

That the portion of the 16 foot alley which lies between 15th Street and the alley between 14th and 15th Streets and further described as being between Lots Numbers Fourteen (14) and Fifteen (15) in Block Number Thirty-four (34), Selah Chamberlain's Addition, fronting 16 feet on 15th Street and running Northerly a distance of 154.5 feet to said alley between 14th and 15th Streets, be and the same is hereby vacated.

SECTION 2.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

To vacate a certain unnamed alley lying between Lexington Avenue and Long Avenue and extending Northerly from Fifteenth Street to the East and West Alley lying between Fourteenth and Fifteenth Streets in the City of Lorain, State of Ohio.

WHEREAS, on the fifteenth day of June, 1925, a petition by persons owning lots in the immediate vicinity of a certain unnamed alley lying between Lexington Avenue and Long Avenue and extending Northerly from Fifteenth Street to the East and West Alley lying between Fourteenth and Fifteenth Streets, was duly presented to council praying that said certain unnamed alley, between the points named, be vacated; and notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given as required by law, by publication in times Herald, a newspaper of general circulation in the corporation, for six consecutive weeks ending the twenty sixth day of August, 1925; and,

WHEREAS? council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made, now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, of the City of Lorain, State of Ohio

SECTION 1.

That a certain unnamed alley lying between Lexington Avenue and Long Avenue and extending Northerly from Fifteenth Street to the East and West Alley lying between Fourteenth and Fifteenth Streets in the City of Lorain, be and the same is hereby vacated.

SECTION 2.

That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
