AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1022 STREET OR ALLEY NAME CHANGING, VACATING OR NARROWING PROCEDURE, TO ADD LANGUAGE ALLOWING THE STREET TO REVERT IN EQUAL PORTIONS TO ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS.		

WHEREAS, it has been the past practice of the City to apportion vacated property equally to abutting property owners, and Council and the Administration wish to make that intent clear.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH RIDGEVILLE, LORAIN COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1022 is amended to include the following language:

Equal Apportionment

Any street, alley or other City property vacated pursuant to this Chapter shall revert in equal amounts to the abutting property owners, unless the vacating ordinance specifically states otherwise.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were conducted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in accordance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
