

ORDINANCE NO. 52-94

AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE VACATION OF A CERTAIN ALLEY FROM THE EAST LINE OF ILLINOIS AVENUE EASTERLY TO THE WEST LINE OF INDIANA AVENUE IN THE CITY OF LORAIN, OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the petition to vacate a certain alley located south of East Erie Avenue from the east line of Illinois Avenue, easterly to the west line of Indiana Avenue in the City of Lorain, Ohio was passed as an Ordinance No. 26-94 on March 21, 1994; and

WHEREAS, the form of said Ordinance was the petition to vacate said alley, and not a separately drawn ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Council unanimously approved the vacation of said alley on March 21, 1994.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LORAIN, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION I. That the alley south of East Erie Avenue, from the east line of Illinois Avenue, easterly to the west line of Indiana Avenue, is hereby declared to be no longer needed for a public purpose; that property owners abutting 100% of said alley have petitioned Council to vacate said alley and said alley is hereby vacated effective March 22, 1994.

SECTION II. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION III.

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency, the nature of which is the immediate need to correct improperly passed vacation of said alley in order to preserve the health, welfare and safety of the citizens of the City of Lorain. Therefore, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, providing it receives the statutory requirements for passage, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
