

ORDINANCE NO. 5462

An Ordinance to vacate certain alleys hereinafter set forth more particularly, within the City of Lorain, Ohio.

WHEREAS, on the 7th day of April, 1945, the City Council of the City of Lorain, Ohio, gave notice to persons owning lots in the immediate vicinity of certain alleys hereafter more particularly described; said notice published in The Lorain Journal, a newspaper of general circulation in a corporation for six consecutive weeks, ending May 12, 1945; and

WHEREAS, Council upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for the vacation of said alleys, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made, subject, however, to the reservation of easements to the City of Lorain, for sewers, water lines and other utilities existing therein or for future use,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LORAIN, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1.

That the following alleys from the points named to the termini named, to-wit:

- Alley West of Indiana Avenue from "E" Street to Alley South of East Erie Avenue,
- Alley South of West 21st Street from Beech Avenue to a point 150 feet East of Washington Avenue,
- Alley South of West 22nd Street from Lexington Avenue to Oakdale Avenue,
- Alley South of West 23rd Street from Lexington Avenue to Oakdale Avenue,
- Alley West of Lexington Avenue from West 33rd Street to West 35th Street,
- Alley West of Dayton Avenue from West 30th Street to West 36th Street,
- Alley West of Oakdale Avenue from West 33rd Street to West 36th Street,
- Alley West of Amherst Avenue from West 33rd Street to West 36th Street,

be and the same are hereby vacated, subject, however, to a reservation for ingress and egress for sewers, water lines and other utilities of the City of Lorain, Ohio, or its designated agencies, which is to be an easement reservation for such purposes.

SECTION 2.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
