ORDINANCE NO. 59-156

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE EASTERN HEIGHTS BOULEVARD FROM THE EAST SIDE OF SOUTH LOGAN AVENUE TO THE EAST END OF LOTS NO. 278 and 91 ON EASTERN HEIGHTS BOULEVARD AND LONGSON AVENUE FROM THE NORTH END OF LOTS NO. 86 AND 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ TO THE NORTH SIDE OF CORNELL AVENUE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on the End of December, 1959, a Petition by the abutting property owners of Eastern Heights Boulevard from the East side of South Logan Avenue to the East end of Lots No. 86 and 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ to the North side of Cornell Avenue was duly presented to Council praying that said Eastern Heights Boulevard and Longson Avenue from the points named be vacated, and

WHEREAS Council upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELYRIA, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1: That Eastern Heights Boulevard from the East side of South Logan Avenue to the East end of Lots No. 278 and 91 on Eastern Heights Boulevard and Longson Avenue from the North end of Lots No. 86 and 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ to the North side of Cornell Avenue be and the same are hereby vacated.

SECTION 2: That this Ordinance is and is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance, the emergency being the immediate necessity to provide for the public health, peace, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Elyria, Ohio, by providing for the education of its children; therefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage and approval.
