

ORDINANCE NO. 66-205

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE APPORTIONMENT OF THE INDEBTEDNESS AND DIVISION OF FUNDS BY THE LORAIN COUNTY AUDITOR CONCERNING THE ANNEXATION OF APPROXIMATELY 35.03 ACRES OF LAND IN ELYRIA TOWNSHIP TO THE CITY OF ELYRIA, IN WHICH CALVIN E. CARSTENSEN WAS THE AGENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 66-174, this Council accepted the application of Calvin E. Carstensen for the annexation of approximately 35.03 acres of land in Elyria Township to the City of Elyria; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 709.12, Ohio Revised Code, the County Auditor shall ascertain, adjust and divide between the municipal corporation and the unannexed portion of the township any unencumbered balances on hand to the credit of any fund of such township in the same proportion as the division and apportionment of indebtedness; and,

WHEREAS, Joseph J. Mitock, Lorain County Auditor, has certified by letter that there is no necessity for the apportionment of indebtedness as Elyria Township has no indebtedness, and that a portion of unencumbered balances amounted to .0189%, or \$11.29, said \$11.29 being the apportioned balance in the Elyria Township Fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELYRIA, STATE OF OHIO;

SECTION 1: That the apportionment of Indebtedness and division of funds made by Joseph J. Mitock, Lorain County Auditor, relating to the annexation of approximately 35.03 acres of land in Elyria Township to the City of Elyria in which Calvin E. Carstensen was the Agent, accepted by this Council by Ordinance No. 66-174 on September 6, 1966, as to .0189% unencumbered balances in the fund of Elyria Township amounting to \$11.29, be and the same hereby is accepted.

SECTION 2: That the Solicitor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to effect collection forthwith of the sum of \$11.29 from the Board of Trustees of Elyria Township.

SECTION 3: That this Ordinance is and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the emergency being the immediate necessity to provide for the public health, peace and welfare of the people of the City of Elyria by providing for the acceptance of apportionment of indebtedness and division of funds made by the Lorain County Auditor concerning annexation of a part of a township to this municipal corporation pursuant to Section 709.12, Ohio Revised Code; wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage and approval.
