RESOLUTION NO. 79-117

In the matter of granting a road)
vacation of Southwood Court in)
Carlisle Township.)

February 8, 1979

WHEREAS, after due and sufficient legal advertising of the day fixed for the public hearing on determining to vacate Southwood Court in Carlisle Township; and after hearing and due consideration thereof a motion was duly made and seconded;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Lorain County, Ohio, that we do and hereby determine to vacate Southwood Court in Carlisle Township for which the road description reads as follows:

Situated in the Township of Carlisle, County of Lorain and State of Ohio and known as being a part of Original Carlisle Township Lot No. 4 and bounded and described as follows:

"Legal description for Southwood Court as recorded in Volume 20, page 7 of Lorain County Plat Records.

Original section number 4, Carlisle Township, Lorain County, State of Ohio.

Commencing at the intersection of the northerly line of Southwood Drive and the westerly line of Southwood Court. Said point being the southeasterly corner of subplot number 28, in Southwood Subdivision Number 2, as recorded in volume 20, page 7 of Lorain County Plat Records;

Thence North 0° 02' east, along the westerly line of Southwood Court, a distance of 140.68 feet to the northeast corner of subplot number 28;

Thence South 89° 58' east, 60.00 feet to the northwest corner of subplot 29 in Southwood Subdivision Number 2;

Thence South 0° 02' west, along the easterly line of Southwood Court, a distance of 140.68 feet to the southwest corner of subplot number 29;

Thence North 89° 58' west, along the northerly line of Southwood Drive, a distance of 60.00 feet to the place of beginning of the land herein described, and being about 0.19 acre of land, be the same more or less, but subject to all legal highways.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that said vacation shall accrue to the benefit of adjacent property owners as provided by law.

The foregoing resolution was introduced upon a motion by Commissioner Jeresmo J. Keron, seconded by Commissioner Fred M. Ritenauer and the vote taken thereon resulted as follows: Jeresmo J. Keron, "aye"; Fred M. Ritenauer, "aye"; Alan J. Zaleski, "aye".
