

ORDINANCE NO. 8568

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 845 WHICH RE-ESTABLISHED THE DOCK OR WHARF LINES OF THE BLACK RIVER BETWEEN THE ERIE AVENUE BRIDGE AND POINTS OPPOSITE THE FOOT OF THE ISLAND IN SHEFFIELD TOWNSHIP AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LORAIN, STATE OF OHIO

SECTION 1: That a portion of Section No. 2 of Ordinance No. 845 passed and approved on the 1st day of August, 1904, and amended by Ordinances Nos. 4513 and 5209 designating the location of dock lines and points shall be further amended by relocating the dock line as follows:

Beginning at existing dock corner No. 126 whose coordinate (according to the United States Government Coordinate System) is N 2338.51 and E 7642.09, thence N 19° 48' 45" W in the existing dock line between Dock Corners No. 126 and No. 124, a distance of 83.01 feet to proposed dock corner No. 124-A, whose coordinate is N 2416.61 and E 7613.96, which is the place of beginning of the new dock line; thence S 33° 41' 12" E a distance of 112.04 feet to proposed Dock Corner No. 126-A, said corner being in the existing dock line between Dock Corners No. 126 and No. 128, whose coordinate is N 2323.38 and E 7676.10 and is the terminus of the new dock line established under this ordinance .

SECTION 2: That the map of the dock lines as filed in the office of the City Engineer (X-9) be corrected to indicate the dock line relocation as designated in this ordinance.

SECTION 3: That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance, the nature of the emergency being the immediate necessity for the correcting of Black River dock lines within the City of Lorain, Ohio, to permit the Federal Government to engage in their dredging program and for the improvement of the property of the riparian owner adjoining the said dock line, all for the welfare and convenience of the inhabitants of the City of Lorain, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
