ORDINANCE NO. 87-/8/

AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE PORTION OF A CITY OWNED EASEMENT SOUTH OF THE SOUTH LINE OF THE VACATED HIGH STREET THROUGH PROPERTY CURRENTLY OWNED BY AMES LAWN AND GARDEN TOOLS, AN DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council is satisfied that there is good cause shown for the vacation of the portion of a City owned easement South of the South line of the vacated High Street through property currently owned by Ames Lawn and Garden Tools, and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELYRIA, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1: That the portion of a City owned easement South of the South line of the vacated High Street through property currently owned by Ames Lawn and Garden Tools hereinafter described be and the same hereby is vacated:

Situated in the City of Elyria, County of Lorain, and State of Chio, and bounded and described as follows:

Part of the easement area granted for sewer construction to the City of Elyria on the seventh day of February, 1935 by Steel and Tubes Incorporated and recorded in book 293, pages 195 through 197 of the Lorain County Recorder's records and more fully described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Easterly line of the Baltimore & Ohio railroad right-of-way and the Southerly line of Walnut Street, as shown by the plat of Ely and Boynton's second addition to the City of Elyria, which was recorded on November 29, 1907 in Volume 7 at Page 25 of the Lorain County Plat Records; thence Easterly along said Southerly line of Walnut Street, vacated a distance of twenty (20.00) feet to a point; thence Northerly along a line parallel to the Westerly line of Adams Street a distance of three hundred sixty-six feet (366) more or less to a point in the Southerly line of High Street, as recorded in the above noted plat records; thence Westerly along the Southerly line of High Street vacated to its intersection with the Easterly line of the Baltimore & Ohio railroad right-of-way; thence Southerly along the Easterly right-of-way line of the Baltimore & Ohio railroad to the point of beginning.
