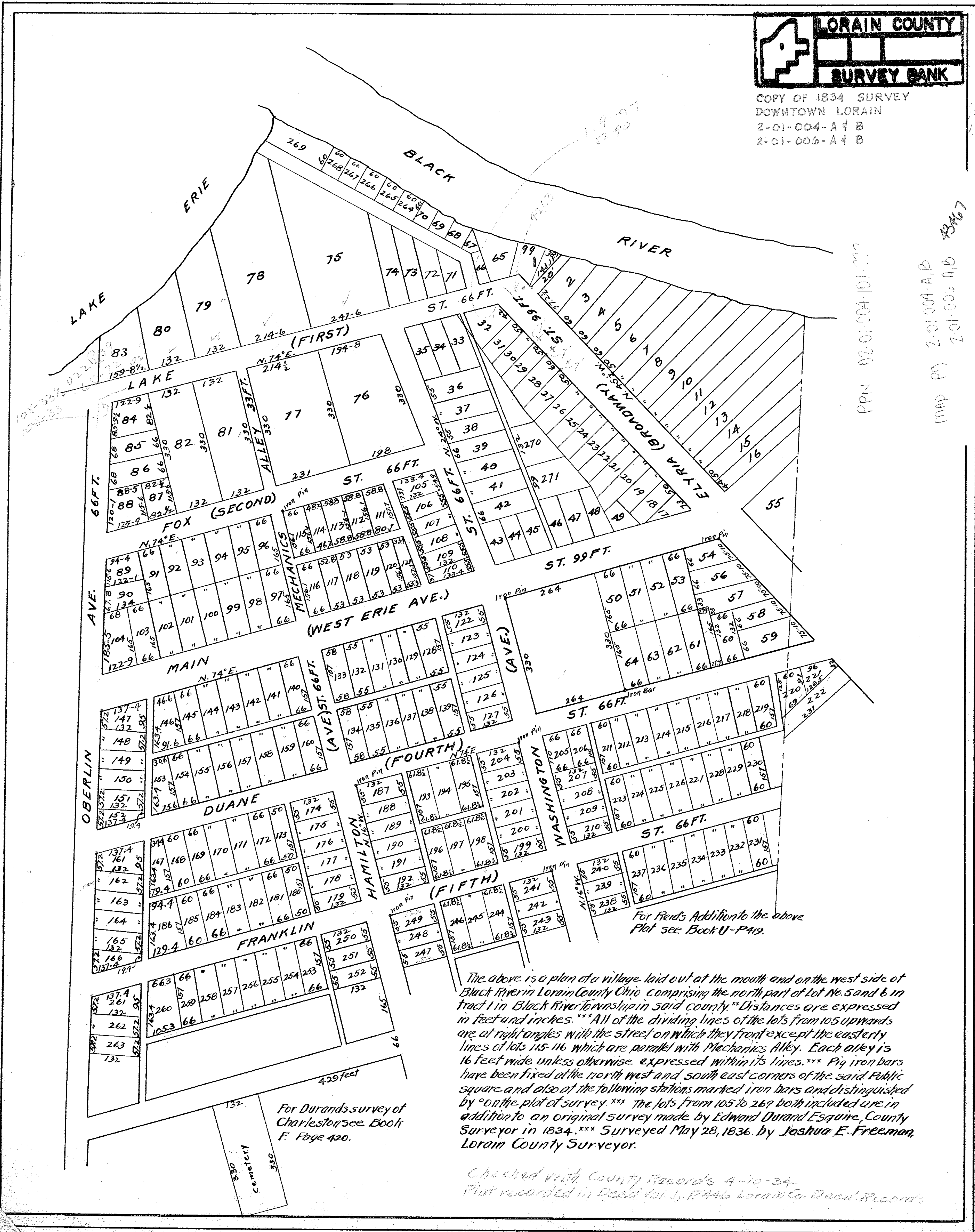

The above is a plan of a village laid out at the mouth and on the west side of Black River in Lorain County Ohio comprising the north part of Lot No. 5 and 6 in tract 1 in Black River Township in said county. Distances are expressed in feet and inches. All of the dividing lines of the lots from 105 upwards are at right angles with the street on which they front except the easterly lines of lots 115-116 which are parallel with Mechanics Alley. Each alley is 16 feet wide unless otherwise expressed within its lines. Pig iron bars have been fixed at the north west and south east corners of the said Public square and also at the following stations marked iron bars and distinguished by ° on the plat of survey. The lots from 105 to 269 both included are in addition to an original survey made by Edward Durand Esquire, County Surveyor in 1834. Surveyed May 28, 1836. by Joshua E. Freeman, Lorain County Surveyor.
