E. W. Bohann, D. West, Thos. Gawn, surveyors. E. S. Jackson Jr. Surveyor. Gentlemen: You were appointed by the County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, to view, survey and establish a proposed road, in the following route as petitioned for by John D. Riedrich, beginning on the town line between Cern and Ridgerville, to commence on the west line of the north and South Center road and extend west on the line between Cern and Ridgerville townships to the Stony Ridge road (so called.)

You are therefore directed with E. S. Jackson the surveyor appointed by me to meet at M. Tolle, on the 18th day of April 1896, or on your failing to meet that day, within five days thereafter and proceed to view, survey and lay out the said road, and determine whether the public convenience requires that such road or any part thereof shall be sixty feet in width, or whether ~~it~~ ^{it} be narrower than sixty feet will as well promote the public convenience and report the width in your opinion the same should be established and opened.

The law requires (Sec. 4676), that "the view so and surveyor shall meet at the time and place specified in the order of the Commissioners, and after taking an oath faithfully and impartially to discharge the duties of their appointments, respectively, shall take to their assistance two suitable persons, or chain-carriers, and one marker, and proceed to view, survey and lay out or alter the road as proposed for in the petition, or as near the same as in their opinion a good road can be made at reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals, as well as to the public, if such road or any part thereof, is established and opened or altered," and also (Sec. 4672) that they "shall also be as wary to assess and determine the compensation to be paid in money for the property sought to be appropriated, without deduction for title to any property of the owner, and to assess and determine how much less valuable, if any, the land or premises from which such appropriation may be taken, will be rendered by the opening and

construction of the road. And you are further required to make and sign a report - in writing, stating your opinion in favor of or against the establishment or alteration of the road, or any part thereof, and set forth the reasons of the same, which report, to gether with the plat and survey of the road, or alteration, shall be delivered to the County Auditor by me of the return on or before the first day of our session in June next. You will also at the time you make your report of the view, also make a separate report, in writing, stating the amount of damages, if any, and to whom, to you accord, which would accrue by the opening of the road, and file the written applications on which such assessments have been made, with the County Auditor, and to further proceed in your proceedings under the order of the provisions of the statute in such case made and provided.

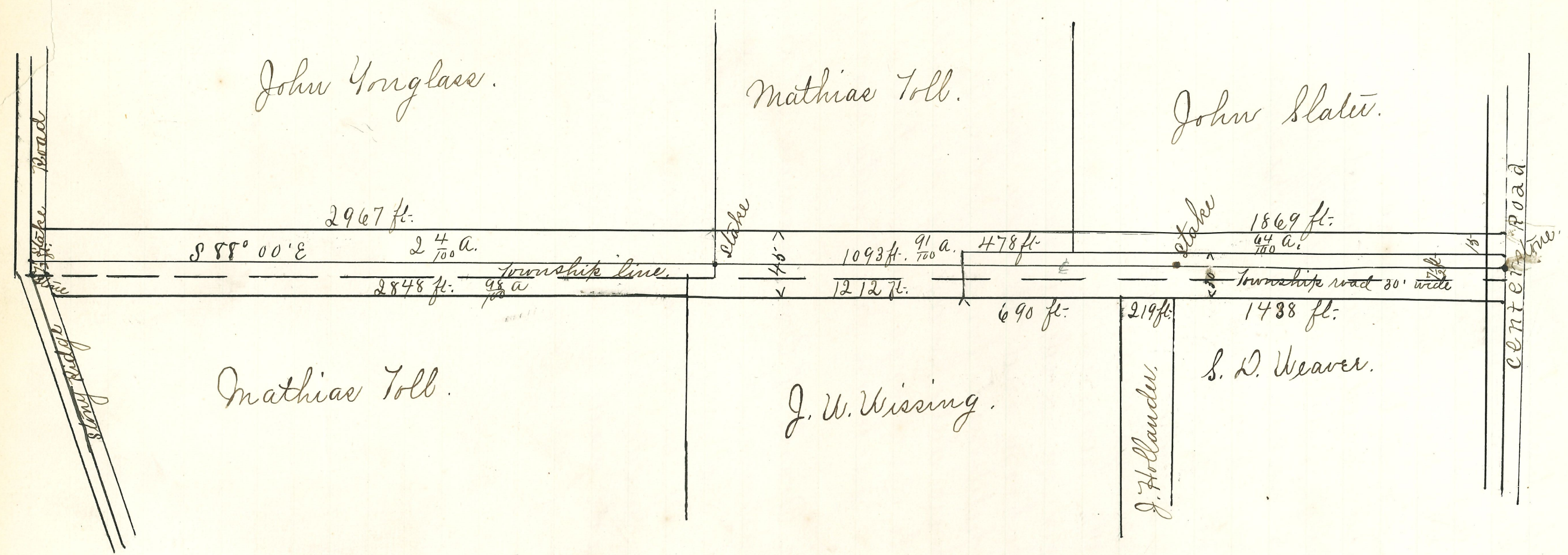
