 faithful payment of which well and truly to be made,
 we bind ourselves, jointly, and severally, our heire,

 sealed with our seals and, dated at Ridgerville this
 28th day of Sept. 1895.

The conditions of the above obligation are such, that;
 whereas application has been made to the Board of
 Commissioners of said Brown County, for the opening of
 a public road on the following line, to-wit:

Now if the said application shall pay into the Treasury
 of said County the amount of all cost and expenses
 according thereto, in case the said application shall
 fail; or if the Commissioners shall order the said cost
 and expenses, or any part thereof, to be paid by the
 petitioners, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to

 time required by law, on motion of Hayes, seconded

Surveyor. Gentlemen: You were appointed by the County Commissioners of Lorain County, Ohio, to view, survey and establish a proposed road on the following route as petitioned for by John R. Dredick, beginning on the town line between Avon, and Ridgeville, to commence on the west line of the North and South Center road and extend west, on the line between Avon and Ridgeville townships to the Stony Ridge road (so called.)

You are therefore directed with E. S. Jackson the surveyor appointed by us to meet at Mr. Tolle, on the 18th day of April 1896, or on your failing to meet that day, within five days thereafter, and proceed to view, survey and lay out the said road, and determine whether the public convenience requires that such road or any part thereof shall be sixty feet in width, or whether ~~the~~ ^{the} width than sixty feet will as well promote the public convenience, and report the width in your opinion the same should be established and opened.

The law requires (Sec. 4646), that "The viewers and surveyor shall meet at the time and place specified in the order of the Commissioners, and after taking an oath faithfully and impartially to discharge the duties of their appointments respectively, shall take to their assistance two suitable persons, as chain-carriers, and one marker, and proceed to view, survey and lay out, or alter the road as required for the purpose, faithfully and impartially to discharge the duties of their appointments respectively, shall take to their assistance two suitable persons, as chain-carriers, and one marker, and proceed to view, survey and lay out, or as near the same as in their opinion a good road can be made at reasonable expense, laying into consideration the utility, convenience, inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals, as well as to the public; if such road, or any part thereof, is established and opened or altered; and also (Sec. 4642) that they "shall also be duty to assess and determine the compensation to be paid in money for the property sought to be appropriated, without deduction for benefit to any property of the owner and to assess and determine how much these valuable, if any, the land or premises from which such information may be taken, will be rendered by the opening and

construction of the road. And you are further required to make, and sign a report - in writing, stating your opinion in favor of or against - the establishment or alteration of the road, or any part thereof, and set forth the reasons of the same, which report, together with the plat, and survey of the road, or alteration, shall be delivered to the County Auditor by me, or the viewers, or, or before the first day of our session in June next. You will also at the time you make your report - of the view, also make a separable report, in writing, stating the amount of damages, if any, and to whom, by you, assessed, which would accrue by the opening of the road, and file the written applications, on which such assessments have been made, with the County Auditor, and be further governed in your proceedings under this order by the provisions of the statute in such case made and provided.
